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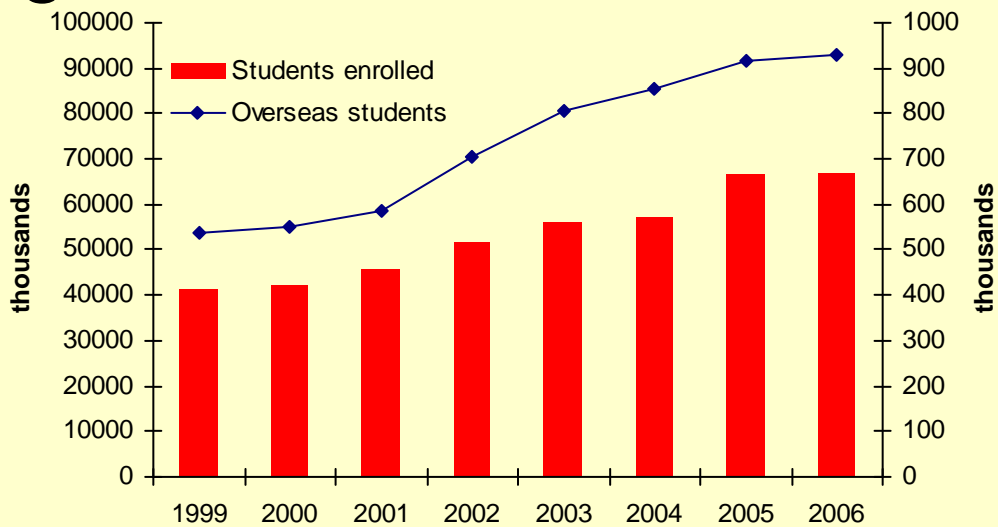
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The first wave of globalization

(Asia is 70% of the growth)

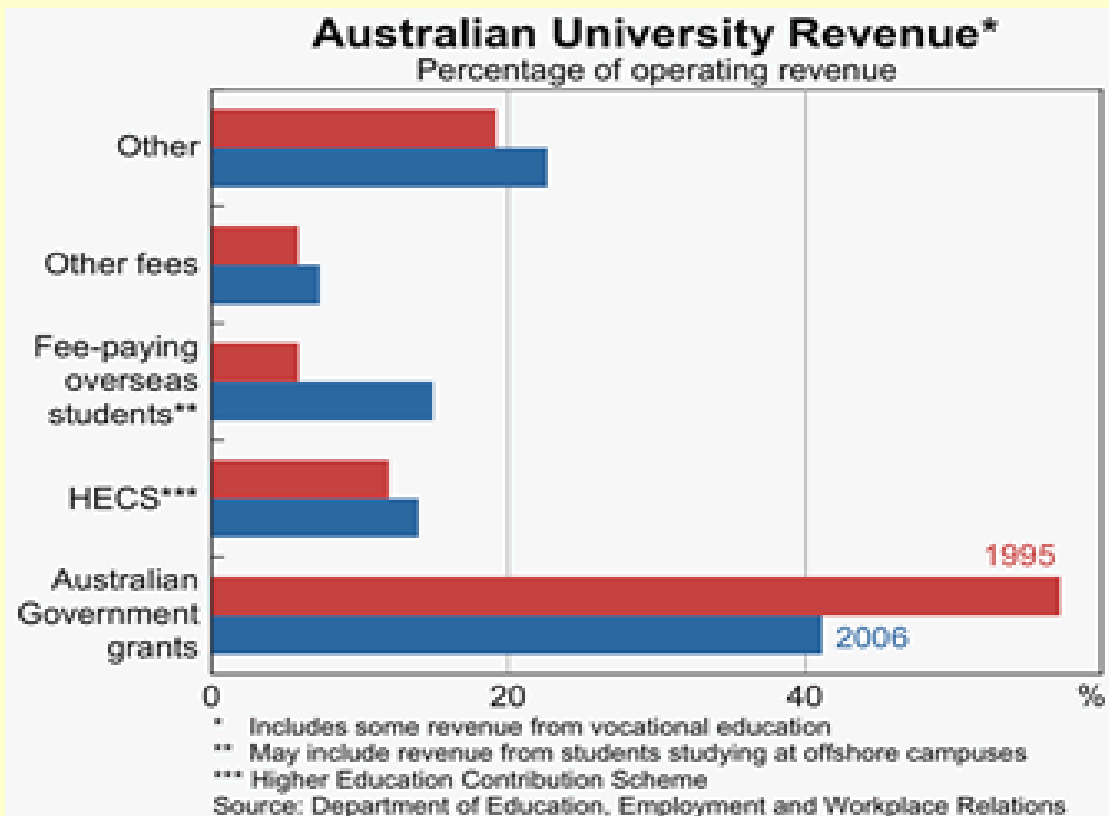
Providers and Programs are Increasingly Mobile/ Cross- border
